



2.2. Courses and language of tuition

All courses from the ENSAE Paris Curriculum (Master of Science and Engineering) are available to exchange students. Find out more about the structure of the French "Engineer Program" <u>here</u>.

To qualify for admission, candidates must have completed at least **3 years of bachelor** before arriving at ENSAE Paris.

Exchanges at ENSAE Paris usually take place at graduate level. However, upon our partners' request, we can exceptionally consider applications from senior bachelor students.

The course selection should be consistent with the student's academic background and their current academic year of enrolment. In addition to the advice of the home institution supervisor, ENSAE Paris can provide assistance regarding courses prerequisites and levels.

It is possible to mix courses from different years, but timetable conflicts may arise, which would require adjustments. You will have two weeks after your arrival to change your course selection.

We offer **French as a foreign language** courses (1,5 hours a week for 2 ECTS) but availability is not guaranteed and is conditioned to the number of exchange students enrolled at ENSAE Paris with the same level of French during the same period.

GRADING SYSTEM AND EXAMS

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Courses are graded on a scale from 0 to 20, with a passing grade of 10/20. We assess academic performances using continuous and/or final exams, in the form of written, oral or practical exams, or essays, depending on the course. A transcript of records will be issued within five weeks of the assessment period's conclusion. Students can request their transcript of records by sending an email to international@ensae.fr.
